We will be looking at symbols and pattern systems throughout our Japanese program this term. We explore important symbols that are used to celebrate Japanese and Australian cultural events including Koinobori (carp streamers) for Children's Day, flowers for Mother's Day and Teru-Teru Bozu (Japanese rain prevention dolls) for the rainy season.
