School Profile:

Morgan Primary and Preschool is situated 160km North East of Adelaide where the Murray River turns South. The school is central to the local community and we provide many opportunities and encourage all members of our community to be actively involved and engaged in all facets of school life.

At Morgan Primary School we want all learners to be part of a caring, inclusive, quality learning environment which empowers everyone to continue life long learning with confidence. Student Wellbeing is a core focus.

The school has a strong focus on ensuring learners achieve their best in Literacy and Numeracy. We provide quality differentiated teaching programmes to ensure each child's strength and needs are accommodated for. We offer a range of specialist subjects with every year level having lessons in Japanese, Arts including Music, Outdoor Education and PE. Online learning and the use of ICT is incorporated into teaching and learning and all classrooms are adequately resourced. Outside we have our Nature Play area and we have recently upgraded our student vegetable garden which includes a bush tucker section.

We have developed activities and events focusing on learning from B-6, promoting parental support and education, supportive intervention programs, successful transition programs and an early years focus on 'learning through play' and literacy and numeracy development. All students enjoy Outdoor Classroom in the Gully (across from the school) This allows opportunities for further exploration, mastery, creativity and leadership.

Special Site Arrangements: Our site is part of the Waikerie Partnership consisting of 7 schools and preschools.

2. Students (and their welfare)

- General characteristics: Morgan Primary is a small school with a family and community atmosphere. The school draws students from the local town and surrounding rural communities. The school currently has 3 classes, configured as R-1 class, Yr2-3 class and Yr4-6 class. We also have a preschool.
- Student well-being programs: The school is a Trauma Aware School using the Berry Street Program, values education, and healthy breakfast and lunch events.

 - Student's families are supported by all staff, the Principal and our Wellbeing Support Worker. Intervention and specific programs are and will continue to be used for students / families requiring additional support.

Student support offered:

Individual, group and whole class support is provided by both teachers and SSOs. Small group reading support is provided by teachers and SSOs for all students who are identified through our whole-school data monitoring processes. SSOs support individual students to achieve their One Plan goals. The size of our school enables all staff to know each student well allowing us to easily identify, and then plan, interventions for students who may need support with their emotional wellbeing, behaviour or learning.

Student management:

Behaviour is managed through a clear process that involves positive reinforcement and clear consequences. The SRC, Governing Council and staff have developed a whole school code of conduct. At Morgan Primary & Preschool, high-level behavioural incidents are rare.

Student government:

School Leaders are elected at the beginning of each year. There are two House Captain (Blue and Gold) and School Leaders from our Year 6 cohort. The Student Representative Council is made up of 2 other students per classroom assisting the School Leaders, Principal and staff, and students with issues raised by the student body, fundraising and model appropriate social behaviours.

Special programmes:

Preschool – children are entitled to access 4 terms (1 year) of government preschool in the year before they start school. 2023 introduced a mid-year intake into preschool. This means that from 2023 children who turn 4 years old:

- before 1 May are eligible to start preschool at the beginning of the year.
- on 1 May to 31 October can commence preschool through the mid-year intake at the start of term 3 of that year
- after 31 October will be eligible to commence preschool at the start of the following year.

Regardless of whether your child starts at the beginning of the year, or through a midyear intake they will undertake 4 terms of preschool.

Preschool sessions are held over a fortnightly cycle so children attend:

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday 3x6 hour sessions (Odd Weeks) Monday, Tuesday 2x6 hour sessions (Even Weeks)



Pre-Entry Community Care - Our Pre-Entry program continues to offer 4 places each Tuesday in our Preschool to children who have already turned 3. This is to support development of social skills and an experience of preschool prior to formal entry. It is created in the essence of our site philosophy to work in partnership with families and community to develop children's agency.

Who can attend: Any child has already turned 3 and is already a part of our school community or intends to enrol in our preschool. Four places available each week.

4. Curriculum

Subject offerings:

All eight curriculum areas including: English, Mathematics, Humanities and Social Sciences (HASS), Science, Design and Technology, The Arts, Health & Physical Education and Languages: Japanese are taught.

Information & Communication Technologies are a central part to all teaching and learning programs at Morgan Primary School. Each classroom is fitted with a Smart TV to support staff and students with teaching and learning. Students have access to an up-to-date network of computers, laptops and ipads.

Open Access/Distance Education provision:

Japanese is taught through the Open Access College. Students receive 1 lesson per week via electronic face to face lesson with their Japanese teacher. A classroom teacher is involved during this lesson.

Special needs:

Students with special needs and disabilities are catered for and supported by their individual One Plans. These plans are developed with the classroom teacher, the Principal, Berri Education Office personnel, students and families. Students are provided with additional support both individually and in the classroom environment by teachers and SSO's. Resources are purchased to assist students with their needs.

Special curriculum features:

Outdoor Education incorporating "The Gully" across the road from the school and vegetable and bushtucker garden. We also provide a whole school camp, with students visiting Arbury Park Outdoor Education camp this year. A specialist music teacher is onsite this year and they are providing private music lessons to families if requested.

Teaching methodology:

Staff at Morgan Primary School, work collaboratively across all areas using the Australian curriculum. A range of methodologies are used and teachers regularly attend professional learning sessions and share experiences, learning and resources.

Morgan Primary School adopts a whole school approach using evidencebased strategies.

9. School Facilities

Buildings and grounds

- The school consists of one stone building, three buildings and two portables.
- The main building houses the front administration office, staff room, SSO Wellbeing Officer room, Upper Primary Class (temporarily), teachers' resources and preparation area, meeting rooms, and Principal's office.
- The playground has been upgraded with the inclusion of new play equipment and a nature play area. 2024 has seen an upgrade to a new vegetable garden and bush tucker outdoor area.
- The Preschool building has a large activity area, office, resource room, laundry, store-room, children's toilets, disabled adult toilet and ramp and enclosed kitchen. An enclosed outdoor deck area allows for extended indoor play area. The nature themed grounds are fully established consisting of a large grassed area, sandpit, cubby house, succulent and sensory gardens, a covered learning area and playground equipment. There are also two very large outdoor storage sheds and a shared vegetable patch.

The school community takes great pride in maintaining the buildings and grounds to an immaculate condition. Building 6 is currently under renovation and the Lower and Middle Primary classes will move in once completed. The Upper Primary will then move in to building 4.
